- Since October 21, 2005 SOIA/PRM has been used a total of 43 days

- The Burlingame Representative indicated the City of Burlingame has also recently approved the MOU update
- 6. Consideration/Approval of a Recommendation from the Roundtable Work Program Sub-Committee; re: Roundtable Work Program for FY 2005-2006 —

Comments / Concerns / Questions:

- The GRE (Ground Run-up Enclosure) was removed from the Work Program due to the fact that the overall feasibility of SFO being able to install one in the very near future is very low
- A possible upgrade to the new noise monitoring system is a ground run-up detection system
- The GRE will be revisited in the future
- Staff will look into condensing "Noise 101" into two sessions instead of the proposed three sessions
- A suggestion to add to the Work Program for FY 2005-2006 informational presentations to be given to the various County Supervisors and Cities was made
- A suggestion to video tape meetings and guest speakers to replay on public access TV was made (Roundtable staff will provide a future report on this suggestion)

7. Review of Altitude of SFO Oceanic Arrivals Via the Woodside VOR

a. Background / Overview – Marland Townsend / Patty Daniel

Comments / Concerns / Questions:

- NORCAL TRACON is the 3rd or 4th busiest TRACON in the U.S.
- NORCAL TRACON deals with three very busy airports close together (SFO, SJC, OAK)
- NORCAL TRACON averages between 4,500 and 5,000 operations per day
- Controllers work specific sectors that are limited to specific assigned altitude ranges
- NORCAL TRACON has approximately 30 sectors to cover
- Some of the over flights experienced over and around Portola Valley are not Oceanic Arrivals
- Conflicts can not be seen on the SFO live radar track website
- The reason conflicts can't be seen on the SFO live radar track website is because the controllers are doing their jobs
- Controllers have to plan ahead and incorporate a three-dimensional space
- Controllers are looking at a two-dimensional display but interpreting it as a three-dimensional space
- Aircraft are coming from all directions at over 250 mph and controllers have to use altitudes and vectors to keep them separated
- "TRACON" is an acronym for Terminal Radar Approach Control
- "VOR" is an acronym for VHF Omni-directional Range (Navigational Aid)
- "MDA" is an acronym for Minimum Descent Altitude
- Standard separation of aircraft is 1,000 feet vertically and/or 3 miles horizontally
